1994 Indiana All-Star and AP & ICGSA 1st team all-state... graduated 2nd in school career scoring (1,109 points), 561 career rebounds and set six school records including season scoring (518 points), single-game scoring (43), season FT% (79.2%), season FG% (52.3%), 3FG% and single-game 3FGs (7)... Averaged 28.8 points and 11.3 rebounds senior year and 16.5 points and 9.5 rebounds as junior for 17-5 South Central Conference champions under coach Brenda Simmons, earning 1993 Metro Player of the Year and all-sectional honors... totaled 1,085 career points and 467 rebounds at University of Louisville on teams that had three 20+ win seasons and was named 3rd team all-conference and Red & Black Scholar Athlete with a GPA of 3.5 or higher... a teacher for 16 years, she is currently a 6th grade math teacher in Louisville... married with two children, she resides in Louisville, Kentucky.
